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
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
Exploring the significance of digital skills in the workplace context and how they are shaping the workforce landscape in Stockport

- However, vacancy data reveals that the number of advertised vacancies has declined since 2022

- The demand for this set of skills is not specific to the digital sector alone, but cuts across all other sectors in GM.
